WMML Categories & Format

The six competing categories are:

1. **Arithmetic and Number theory**
2. **Algebra 1**
3. **Geometry**
4. **Algebra 2**
5. **Trigonometry and Complex Numbers**
6. **Pre-Calculus**

Format:

A. Six students from each school will compete per meet (no more than 6, can have less than 6)

1. **MAXIMUM of 3 Seniors**
2. **MAXIMUM of 5 Juniors and Seniors (combined)**
3. **MINIMUM of 1 underclassperson (sophomore/freshman)**

B. Each student will compete in 3 categories and be allowed 10 minutes to do three questions. Each category consists of 3 increasingly difficult questions worth 1, 2 and 3 points, respectively. Each student competes in three categories and can therefore earn a maximum of 18 points per meet or 90 points for the competitive season.

C. **At the 2nd and 4th meets, a team round will be held.** All 6 students (or less if a team has fewer than 6 in attendance) who competed on the given team round day will compete as a team. Each team round consists of 6 questions, one from each of the basic six categories. Each is worth 3 points for a maximum of 18 points.

D. While there is no formal written rule, the first three categories are intended for underclasspersons; the last three for seniors.

E. We hope to be able to present awards again at some point as we are looking for a new sponsor.
